Alphabet Photography

Procedure:

- 1. <u>Identify</u>: Explain how this technique might be useful in your own photography.
- 2. **Take your shots**: (26)
 - a. Take **creative** shots of objects that show each letter of the alphabet.
 - b. Take **LOTS** of pictures. Each letter should be <u>found</u>, <u>not created</u>. They need to be objects that were not originally intended to be letters.
 - c. Take **quality** shots. Ensure it's not blurry, crooked, too dark, too light, etc.
 - d. Take a "good" picture. Pay specific attention to balance and avoiding mergers for this assignment. Be sure to check that there's nothing in your background. The images need to be clear and crisp with no distracting parts (no mergers).
- 3. **Write a caption:** in 1-3 sentences that explain this project to someone who has never taken a photography class before.

Grading:

- **Creativity**: Is your image unique, or does it does look like others? Did you try unusual viewpoints or methods?
- **Craftsmanship**: Did you turn in a quality shot? Or is it blurry, crooked, too dark, too light, etc.?
- **Composition**: How did you use the rules of composition in your images? Did you sufficiently display each letter of the alphabet?
- **Caption**: Did you write 1-3 sentences that explain this project to someone who has never taken a photography class before?
